

New NJ Licensed Site Remediation Professional (LSRP) Rules Finalized

Background

SRRA authorizes LSRPs to oversee the remediation of contaminated sites in New Jersey in lieu of the old New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) case manager system. It initially called for the issuance to LSRPs of temporary licenses by NJDEP (which the agency started to issue in November 2009) and, subsequently, a permanent licensing program with licenses issued by the SRRA-mandated Board. The Board started issuing licenses under the statutory terms of the program (i.e., without regulations) in 2012 and the last temporary licenses expired in February 2013. The LSRP Rules are intended to flesh out the Board's jurisdiction and LSRP responsibilities in the areas noted above.
